Intros Camp is specifically designed to give younger youth a great introductory camp experience within a shortened time frame (Sunday-Wednesday). CANOE CAMP: July 14 - 19

Canoe Camp is an off-site adventure where campers live on the shores of Redfish Lake, enjoy canoeing daily, Bible Study and devotion time, and building community with a small group. Swimming, fishing, and hiking are also part of the experience. All skill levels welcome.

TRAILS CAMP: July 28 - August 2

Trails Camp invites campers to explore the Sawtooth or White Cloud Mountains around camp. Campers set up a base camp where they return nightly after spending their days hiking along backcountry trails in God's beautiful creation. Campers will cook outdoors and sleep under the stars all while developing community and connecting to their faith through daily Bible Study.


### SENIOR HIGH

ON-SITE: July 14 - 19

On-site Senior High Camp offers campers freedom in their daily adventures with opportunities to canoe, hike backcountry trails, and swim. Campers will spend one night under the stars with their cabin group, experiencing Bible Study and worship around a campfire. Extra program offerings include a full-day horseback ride and a whitewater rafting trip.

**ADVENTURE CAMP:** July 14 - 19 \$470\* / \$570\* / \$720\*

Senior High Adventure Camp is packed with exciting activities each day, including a full-day horseback riding experience, a rafting trip down the Salmon River, mountain biking, and canoeing on Redfish Lake. Campers return to camp each night to have evening worship and Bible Study. One night will be spent in tents under the stars. \*All activities included in the price.

BACKPACK CAMP: July 28 - August 2 \$370 / \$470 / \$691

Senior High Backpack Camp focuses on setting goals, faith exploration and team building as campers spend time exploring the backcountry trails of the Sawtooth or White Cloud Mountains. Campers experience a unique journey as they participate in daily Bible Study while climbing peaks and exploring the beauty of God's creation.

In the evenings, Luther Heights hosts an all camp event, followed by worship. The schedule is designed to be flexible and accommodating for your enjoyment.

Introducing a brand new program to Luther Heights: Grand Camp! Grandparents, gather your grandkids and come to the mountains to enjoy creation, Bible Study and intentional time devoted to strengthening relationships between grandparents and your grandkids. Share a cabin and spend the shortened week enjoying camp activities together, including campfires, hiking, and worship. Grand Camp brings multiple generations together for an unforgettable experience.

Family Camp and Grand Camp participants can choose to include any of our add-ons to their camp experience.

#### REGISTRATION

A \$50 minimum deposit is due at time of registration. Full payment of registration fee is due 30 days before the first day of camp. Registration can be done online at www.lutherheights.org or over the phone at (208) 886-7657. All major credit cards are accepted. Payment is not accepted at camp other than for Canteen.

#### TIER PRICING

Luther Heights has a three-tier pricing program, with Tier I being the historically subsidized cost of camp. Tier III more closely accounts for the true cost of camp, and Tier II is right in the middle. This program is voluntary and in no way influences the experience anyone will receive. We see it as a way to ensure the camp is available for years to come, and it offers the opportunity for families/individuals to take an active role in supporting the true cost of any camp experience at Luther Heights.

Multiple Children: second child \$10 off, third (+) child \$20 off.

All discounts will be applied after \$50 minimum deposit is made.

	Casual Clothing. Camp is informal. Be prepared for either warm or cool weather no matter the time of year, so make sure you have layers.
	Warm Jacket. You may even want to pack mittens and a warm hat.

	T-Shirts and a Sweatshirt
	Tennis Shoes and/or Hiking Boots. Make sure you have a pair of comfortable, closed-toed shoes for hiking and camp games (required).
	Sandals. Perfect for the beach! Sandals should be strapped (Keens, Chaco, Tevas. Flip-flops are not allowed other than for shower shoes).
	Socks, Underwear, etc.

	Bath Towel and Soap, Shampoo and Conditioner

	Sunscreen and Bug Spray
	Reusable Water Bottle. It's important for campers to drink more water at higher elevations.

### MONEY

Canteen money is collected at Registration for purchases throughout the week and is not allowed to be kept in the cabins. We have canteen open twice per day for campers to buy a snack or drink. The canteen also has t-shirts, sweatshirts, postcards, water bottles, etc. for purchase. Canteen is also open during registration and after closing worship. (?)

We also have a special offering taken during closing worship, which goes to a charitable organization chosen by the camp. Campers are encouraged to donate their remaining canteen balance to this cause.

**Registration:** Registration is from 2 - 5 PM on the first day of camp (Sunday for all youth programs). Campers will get checked in and settled into their cabin, meeting their counselors and LHBC staff. Parents and guardians are welcome to stay for the evening meal at 5 PM.
